Dear Peet:-

I am in receipt of your letter of April 8th and the attached claim forwarded for 1914-15 Riband. I am enclosing your issue herewith, and receipt which I should be glad if you will sign and return.

I am enclosing for you to fill out, a Claim Form for War Service Gratuity; as soon as this has been received again, I shall pass it to the Paymaster with instructions to forward your cheques to your P.O. address. In case you have not yet seen the Regulations governing this Gratuity I am forwarding for your information the preliminary notice published in the local Press which covers the case.

We still have about 1800 men to come home; about 900 at Winchester and about 800 in France at Rouen and the balance in hospitals. We are expecting most of them to embark about the 20th of May and the balance shortly afterwards.

I should be glad to hear from you at any time, and to know that you are doing well and keeping fit. I shall drop you a line again when I am a little less rushed. In the meantime, I wish you the best of luck.

I sincerely hope Sir that you are enjoying good health
since returning home. And am pleased to learn that you
now hold the rank of Lieut Colonel.

I often cast my mind back over the good old times
we spent together in the old C.L. B armory, when you
were Corporal of our section. At that time neither of us
dreamed of going to war and fighting in the same Regiment,
and thank God we both came through safely, although
a bit battered.

I don't get much news about the Regt. but I have
heard rumors that they boys are all home again, which I
