JUNE 30th 1921: Bronchial breathing right apex. Fine crepitations both lungs, more pronounced on right. Pulse 88. Temp. 97.3. Very anaemic, coughing a little at night and sweats a good deal, coughs also when walking up hill. Weight 141½ lbs. By this he lost two pounds between June 22nd and June 29th.

JANUARY 31st 1922: Weight 144 lbs. Pulse 100. Chest now normal. Slight cough at night and in morning, has slight expectoration. Examination of urine-normal.

May 2, 1922: Weight 136 lbs. Pulse 104. Not feeling so well since his discharge from Sanatorium and cough is worse, more phlegm. No accompaniments in chest. No adventitious sounds.

JULY 25th 1922: Weight 138½ lbs. Pulse 104. Gets fatigued very easily. Over both lungs breath sounds very much roughened with occasional sonorous rales present at apices. General condition fair only. "Has been confined to bed since previous board for three weeks," he states.

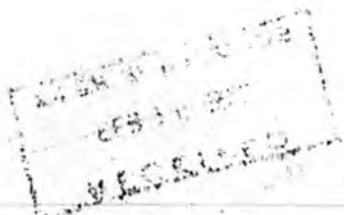
CHEST EXAMINATION:-

Chest is well developed. Expansion is good and equal. No definite dullness made out on percussion. Breathing is somewhat harsh in right upper lobe. No marked change in voice sounds, whispered or spoken. Fremitus is not increased. Left lung; no dullness. Breath sounds are normal. Voice sounds and fremitus is not increased. No rales heard in either lung.

It is understood that this claimant at one time carried a questionable diagnosis, of tuberculosis chronic pulmonary incipient. There is no definite evidence to-day of a chest condition. 



I have received a communication copy of which is enclosed from Mr. James Penney, formerly No. 12448 Pte of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, in which request is made for assistance to enable him and his wife and child to take passages to Montreal

This ex-soldier was repatriated to Newfoundland in the ordinary way, and upon completion of his service, a grant was made to him by the Civil Re-stablishment Committee to enable him to complete a course in motoring in the town of Ayr. The course of instruction now having been completed, Mr. Penney finds it difficult to obtain employment and wishes to go either to New York or Montreal where he thinks his chances of employment are brighter

I have informed Mr. Penney that I have no authority from the Government to assist in providing passages overseas, more especially when it is apparently not his intention to return to Newfoundland.

In case the Government would wish to take Mr. Penney's request for a loan of £60 (sixty pounds) for passage money into consideration, I am enclosing a copy of his letter for perusal

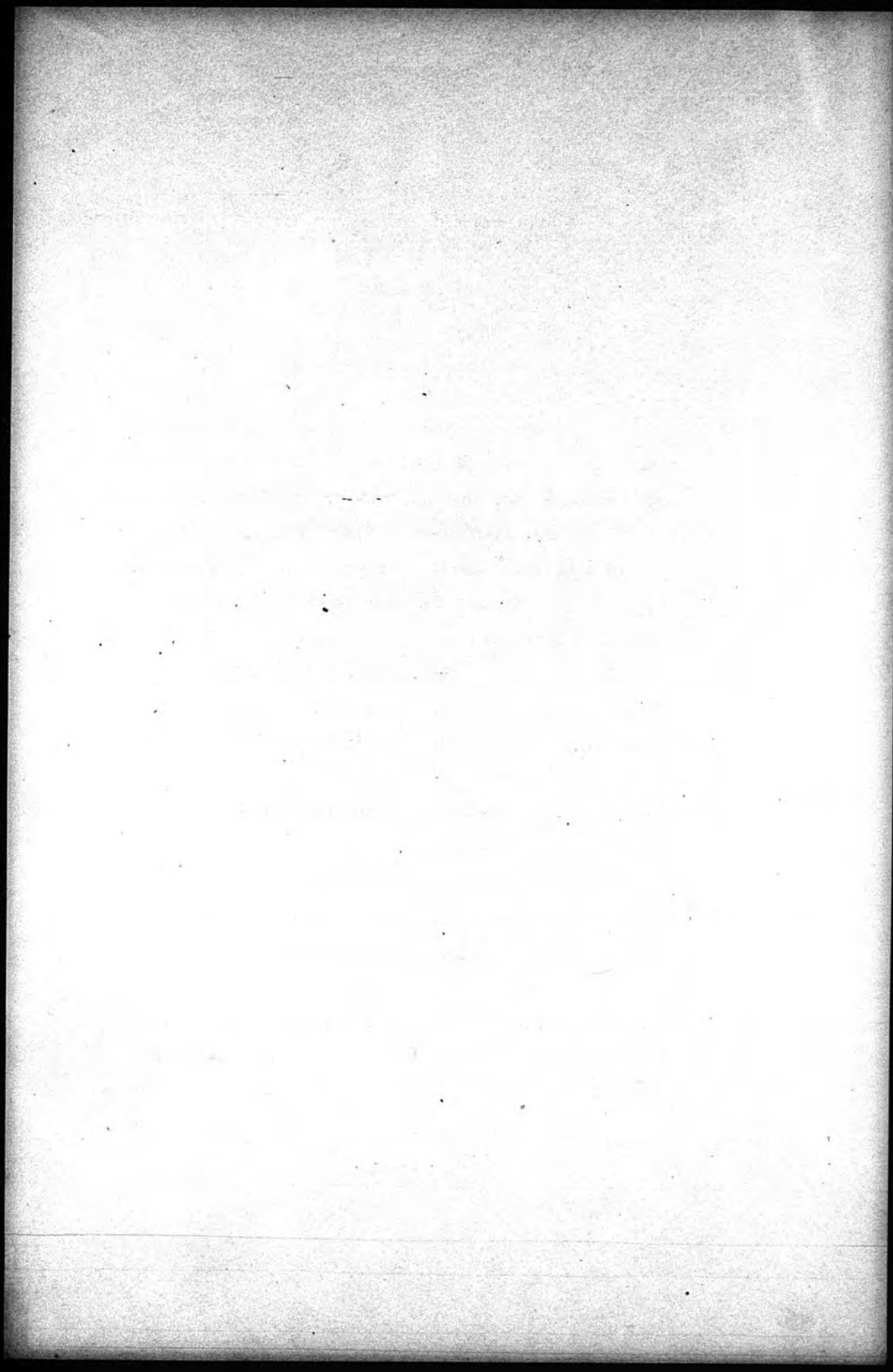

I am in receipt of your letter of 14th June informing me that you have no authority from the Newfoundland Government to arrange free passages overseas. You also mention that I would be ill advised to go to New York at the present time. Well, Sir I must thank you for your advice to me, but if you could only place yourself in my shoes for a time you would see that I am anxious to work but cannot, I have tried hard ever since I completed my course, but in vain, and it takes something to live on these days if you are not bringing in a wage especiall when you have a wife and child staring you in the face. My wife had a letter last week from a friend of hers in Montreal, who is in business there. So if I could get there, he would give me a situation. So I would be much obliged if you would furnish me with the necessary passage money third class fare for us all, £60 (sixty pounds) and I will send payments to you every month from the other side. Trusting this will meet your convenience. I would very much like to sail from Glasgow at the beginning at August. An early reply will oblige

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter of July 15th forwarding letter from the High Commissioner, London, ^{29th June} ~~London~~, together with copy of letter from No. 1448 Ex-Pte. James Penney, respecting a request of this soldier for assistance to enable him and his family to take passage to Montreal.

This man was demobilised on 11th June, 1917. It does not appear probable that this soldier who has been granted a course in motor engineering in Ayr, is unable to obtain employment without having to proceed to Montreal. This course was granted for three months with full allowances, and was extended to a further three months period again with full allowances.

Under the circumstances I submit that the loan of £60 which he asks for should not be granted.
