Dear Mr. Penny:

Mr. Warren has passed your letter of the 21st on to me and I regret that your application is so very late, as the amendment to the War Pensions Act in Section 13, states that:

"A pension shall not be awarded unless an application therefor has been made on or before the 31st day of July, 1928, but where there is an entry in the service or medical documents of the member of the forces, by or in respect of whom pension is being claimed showing the existence of an injury or disease which has contributed to the disability in respect of which pension is claimed, such entry shall be considered an application as of the date thereof for pension in respect of such disability."

I have gone carefully through your files and find that you had gunshot wound of the right shoulder, contusion, and also wound of the left chest wall, slight, but that would be hardly sufficient to connect your present disability with your service disability at this late date, however, if you will forward me reports from your different Medical advisers, showing the exact condition of the lung, I will have the matter taken up by the Special Medical Board for their decision.
