R.A.M.C., who evidently did not know that he was greatly exceeding his powers, has certified that certain men, this man 972 Samuel Penny among them, are "Unfit for Military Service", in some cases even reversing the decision of a Medical Board without stating his reasons. On this certificate these men have been sent from Ayr to St. John's.

In this case of Penny's I recommend that he be brought on for boarding as soon as possible.
