

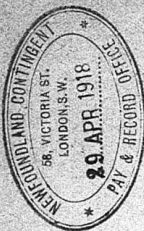

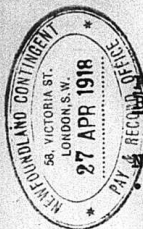

"This N.C.O. was in command of the bombing post at the block at the right of Palz trench on the 3rd March. At about 8.15 am. the enemy attacked from the right under cover of a heavy bombardment thick mist and it is reported also smoke bombs. The enemy got very close without being seen and at the moment of attack a shell fell in the post, killed two of the bombers and wounded one man of a Lewis gun team that was supporting the post. L/Cpl. Picco with the remainder of his men fought for his post and were only driven back when they had thrown all their bombs. The Lewis gun had been hit and put out of action by the first of the enemys bombs and this N.C.O. slightly wounded in the first two fingers of the left hand, but he went on bombing drawing the pins with his little finger. The post was driven back to the communication trench and as soon as more bombs were obtained from the Coy. in support in Potsdam trench L/Cpl. Picco counter attacked along the trench itself, drove our enemy out of our own part of the trench and chased them well down his own part. He helped to build a block 40 yds in advance of our old one and remained in command of the new bombing post. On being relieved that night he marched to Combles and next day at foot inspection the Medical Officer sent him to Hospital with a very bad pair of trench feet."

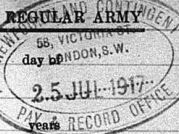

PREMIER PRESENTS WANDSWORTH HOSPITAL WITH CARIBOU HEAD
SOLO L/Opl. PICEO DECORATED WITH THE D.C.M.
BY GENERAL SIR FRANCIS LLOYD

Under the auspices of the Newfoundland War Contingent Association a large number of the friends of Newfoundland were invited to attend at Wandsworth Hospital, to take part in the Ceremony of Presentation of a Caribou Head and an inscribed silver shield to Lieut.Col. Bruce-Porter C.M.G., Officer Commanding the 3rd London General Hospital by the Premier of Newfoundland, and the Presentation by General Sir Francis Lloyd K.C.B., G.V.O., D.S.O., General Officer Commanding London District to L/Opl. Piceo, 1/Newfoundland Regiment of the Distinguished Conduct Medal which he had won by conspicuous bravery in the field of battle.

The function took place at the large hall in the Hospital, familiar to the many hundreds of our soldiers who have passed through Wandsworth.

3 Previous to the Ceremony, the invited guests, amongst whom were included Her Majesty the Queen Amelie of Portugal, Sir Edward and Lady Morris, Mr. and Mrs. A. D. Steel-Maitland, Sir Joseph Outerbridge, Sir Edgar Bowring, Mr. and Mrs. Alex Harvey, Mr. Rowland Williams etc.etc.

Sir Francis Lloyd arrived at 4.15 and the Ceremony began at 4.30.

Major Timewell gave the account of the way in which L/Opl. Piceo won his distinguished award:

"For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. Although wounded, he continued bombing the enemy, and eventually succeeded in driving them back. He then assisted to build a new block and remained in command. He set a splendid example of courage and determination".

General Lloyd, in presenting the medal, paid great tribute to the work of the Newfoundlanders, in the War.

He said it might be reasonable to expect that Peace was not far off, and that the despicable enemy would soon find himself face to face with an inevitable doom.

He said he was very proud to hand to L/Opl. Picoe the medal which he had so gallantly won.

The Chairman, Mr. Steel-Maitland, Under-Secretary of State for the Colonies, said that L/Opl. Picoe's brave deed was not only greatly to be admired individually, but it was representative of the spirit of all Newfoundlanders who faced the dangers of battle.

Sir Edward Morris, on behalf of the Government and people of Newfoundland, then presented the caribou head to Col. Bruce-Porter, C.M.G. Officer Commanding 3rd London General Hospital, with an inscribed silver shield on which the Newfoundland War Contingent Association expressed on behalf of the people of Newfoundland their gratitude for his unvarying kindness to Newfoundland soldiers in the great War.

It betokened, said Sir Edward, the regard in which the Colony held Wandsworth, the Hospital that was Haven to so many of our Newfoundland soldiers. Wandsworth was a household word to the mothers and all the home folk in the Colony where the deepest gratitude was felt to Col. Bruce-Porter and his devoted staff.

In accepting the Presentation, Col. Bruce-Porter wished it to be understood that he did so on behalf of the 3rd London General Hospital, to which any recognition that might be given was due.

He said they had great opportunities in the Hospital of

of witnessing the bravery which was shown by our soldiers under conditions more difficult than on the field of battle, and he often felt that he would like to bestow medals for deeds of heroic endurance.

He looked upon the Hospital as a great means of furthering the Cause of Imperialism, which he had much at heart. The bond of comradeship between the men of the different dominions became very strong in hospital, where they had more chance of being drawn together and knowing each other than when on active service. He thought a sense of brotherhood was created which must tend to closer union throughout the Empire.

It had been a pleasure to do anything he had been able to do for the Newfoundlanders, and he would always have pleasant memories of his association with members of the loyal and oldest dominion.

After the Ceremony an excellent concert had been arranged by Mr. E. R. Morris, and this was enjoyed by a large audience of friends of Newfoundland, and wounded soldiers from all parts of the home country and the dominions, some of them lying in wheeled chairs, many of them having gone through very severe suffering, but all cheery. The singing of the Marseillaise by one of the artistes aroused great enthusiasm, the whole audience standing.

At the close of the entertainment the friends of Newfoundland dispersed, with feelings of good fellowship further cemented by a very delightful afternoon.
