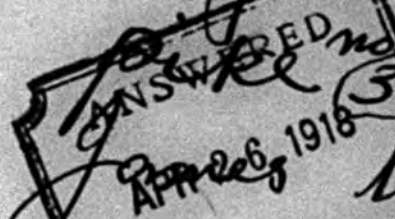

Sir:—

I have been watching with much displeasure the trouble which my father is having concerning his money re. his Separation Allowance. Will you tell me why it was that during my absence, when others recd their money, that my father did not recd his too being as his past letters stated, unable to earn a decent living. When I enlisted I allotted to my father over sixty cents per day, or I may say about 18 dollars per month.

which he need ask.

Now then I am convinced that weather totally incapacitated or not, the money (Separation Allowance) belonged to him. & if so why did he not get it? why was it not sent to him monthly as I understand it should have been. Was it because he had no knowledge of it? & had nobody to intercede for him. being unable to read or write; if that is the reason why he did not get it. then why was it not sent after he learned of it & informed your Dept of it.

if you doubt the truth of his being totally incapacitated you may send around to all the Post Offices in the district

in which we live + get the testimony of the people. I am sure they would be only too willing to render their services to him. As I may add he has been living this winter on the charity of the people of Jamestown. I myself finding it hard enough to support my own family; & cannot give him the needed help. This is why I am anxious that he should get help. Therefore I ask you without delay to give me a reply to these simple questions. & avoid further trouble. I am yours truly



Dear Sir:-

Referring to your letter of Feb.15th.1922,I beg to advise that the decision of the Board of Review of Separation Allowance Claims as conveyed to you in my letter of Feb.7th., is final.

The Board could only pass your claim for payment,if, whilst your son was serving you were totally dependant upon him,and if before he enlisted he was the only support. In order to decide whether you were totally incapacitated during this period,the Board asked for a certificate from your doctor and the certificate that we have received does not state that you have been totally incapacitated.

With regard to your being totally dependent upon your son when he enlisted,your own statement to the effect that his contribution to the family during the year prior to his enlistment was \$30.00 (thirty dollars) and that this amount included his board,might easily be accepted as proof that he was dependent on you,but certainly not that you were dependent upon him.

I regret ,therefore,to have to inform you that the Board of Review of Separation Allowance Claims cannot see their

way clear to change the decision which they have already reached.
