3103 HAROLD PIKE, from January 9, 1919.

January 9, 1919: Through and through wound left forearm, healed. No disability. Wound left thigh and left buttock, both healed. No disability. Large scar over right tibia middle third attached to bone. Wasting of muscles of calf. Unable to walk long distances. Scar over right tibia ready to break down. Painful at edge. Some shortening.

Sept. 5, 1919: Difficulty in walking due to weakness and pain with atrophy and badly nourished scar following osteomyelitis right tibia following gun shot wound. Weakness of left arm from painful and adherent scar right forearm following gun show wound.

Jan. 2, 1920: Healthy looking young man. There is a 4" scar at middle third of right tibia on inner surface of tibia. Scar is 1 1/2" broad at its middle, and is adherent to the bone. Badly nourished and covered with dry scales. At one spot there is an area of tenderness. There is a marked depression in bone and irregularity of contour with prominence of shin. At centre of scar right measures 9 1/2". Left 9". The other scars cause no disability. Movements at knee and ankle are normal. The left calf is a little smaller than right but muscles are plump and firm. There are two scars on left forearm which are not adherent ~~to~~ but have caused some loss of muscle and are tender. March 2, 1923: Difficulty in walking on account of pain and weakness of right leg. The limit of walking he states would be approximately two miles but then the legs would be quite tired. 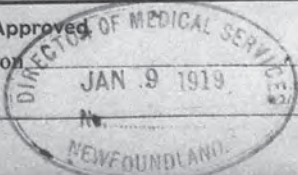

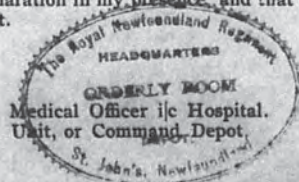
