Owing to the absence of my son, The Ronald D. Pike I beg to acknowledge receipt of yours of Feb'y 2/18 with discharge papers and cheque - also yours of the 2<sup>nd</sup> inst with cheque covering 16<sup>00</sup> as a pension, and yours just as soon as I get a reply from you will forward all papers to him, and will have them returned to you as soon as possible. I noticed in the discharge paper that you fail to record the most serious wounds, on both thighs and ankle. The absence of a record of serious wounds may effect his pension. Allow me to say that when he was re-arrived in England and discharged, the Doctors told him that it would take some 5 or 6 years before he would get the full use of his legs. When he returned he was at College in Sackville taking a course in Civil Engineering, each year, during his vacation he has been with the A. N. W. Cos Eng-ineering Staff, surveying, and of course, travelling all the time. Dec 1917, just about two months after arriving home, he was again offered the same position - but owing to the weakness of his legs (using a stick all the time) was unable

to accept. Under the circumstances, and as he  
could not take up his old work, we thought it better  
for him to return to College. He is now at  
Mount Allison University. Will you please  
inform me as to a statement in form of  
the 2nd inst. Pension - where you state that  
the sum of 16<sup>00</sup> per month will be paid until
