GSW.Head on Rt.side. There is a large part missing from Rt.ear to nose, destroying rt eye, and communicating Zygoma.Wound fairly clean. Wd.Arm. Doing well. 28.5.19.500 Units given.

3.11.18.Improvement of face continues. 6.12.18.Wd.cleaning up.Ready for operation. 17.12.18.Wd.still discharging. 25.12.No improvement. 7.1.19.Wd. has healed well.Except ~~XX~~ at outer canthus. A fair amount of pus still discharges from eye socket. A pledget of cotton wool soaked in red lotion inserted between eyelids.18.2.19. Flaps made at last op.,have now firmly united and Op. wd is healed 25.3.Operation under C & E.A semicircular.incision made at mucocutaneous junction of remains of lr.eyelid.The lr.skin portion was retained downwards. Subsequent a narrow skin flap from upper eyelid was brought down & sutured into gap.
