Sergt. Pitcher was a very brave man and fearless in the face of the enemys and did excellent work up to the time of his death.

The above named soldier met his death by shell fire on the night of Oct. 5th, 1917. He was attached to the transport at the time and left our Rear Headquarters with the transport under Headquarters with the line after the attack which took place that morning, while passing through the ruined village of LANGEMARKTthy met with heavy shell fire in the road, and a shell burst amongst the party instantly killing both Pte. Simms and Lt. Goodyear and mortally wounding three others.

Pte. Simms was buried near LANGEMARKT Church.




