On the morning of 13/7/17 while marching from the trenches two motor lorries overtook us. I called out keep to the right and Private H. Pittman, No. 3404, 1st. Newfoundland Regt. formed two deep; as soon as the first motor lorry has passed he stepped out again and was instantly knocked down by the second lorry. The driver seeing he had knocked down a man stopped, the right hand front wheel being on the man's hand crushed it severely.

I helped the man up passed him over to the stretcher bearers and moved off.



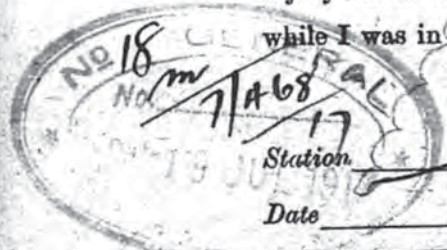

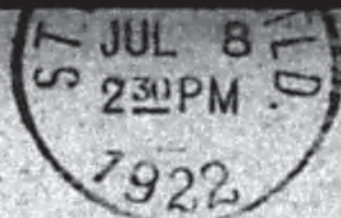

Your letter to the Colonial Secretary with reference to 3404 Private A.H. Pittman, deceased has been passed to this Department for necessary action.

On investigation I find that your allotment on account of this soldier was continued for two years after his death. This continuation of allotment after the death of a soldier is not in accordance with military practice, as a soldier's pay ceases on his death. But at the request of the Pensions Board allotments were continued when payable to parents for a period of two years after the soldier's death. The Pensions Board then took up the claim and refunded to this Department the amount of the allotment paid since death, and also determined whether or not a pension was payable.

I am informed by that Board that in your case pension was not allowed. As far as this Department is concerned I regret that there are no more monies due on account of the estate of the ~~deceased~~ ^{soldier}.

The War Service Gratuity which is eluded to in your letter is a payment only to men on discharge and not payable on account of deceased men.

If there is any reason why you think that a pension should be paid, I would suggest that you communicate with the Secretary of the Board of Pension Commissioners. In this connection I would state for your information that it would be

-2-

Necessary to prove that the deceased soldier was your sole support. It would be necessary therefore, if Mr. Pittman is still alive to show by medical certificate that he is a chronic invalid or totally incapacitated. I am forwarding a Separation Allowance claim form which I should be glad if you will complete and return to this Office.

It must be remembered in filling this out that if the allowance is granted it will cover only the period during which the soldier served; that is from date of enlistment to date of death. When you return the claim to this Department I shall be very pleased to place it before the Board of Review.
