The war being over, ^{Pittman} Pte. being in the Forestry Regiment, his wife being unwell, the family thought that perhaps the military would not mind allowing him to return home.

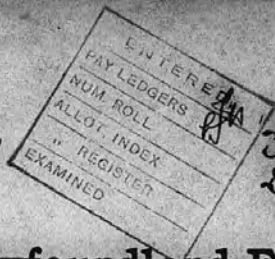
He is a married man with one child, and is certainly needed home. But they are loyal people, and will not complain. But if his services could be spared at this time they would like very much for him to return home.
