Dear Madam,

In reply to your communication of the 5th inst. I beg to state that the above named young man was born at Dunlop St. lands, a settlement about nine miles east of this place. That his sister was Post Mistress here for several years. That on her marriage her brother Jacobus was appointed to the position. That he held the appointment for about two years when he transferred to the Post Office on board the S.S. "Glencoe". During his tenure of office as Post Master here he gave general satisfaction. He always impressed me as being a weak minded lad with little or no will power. He married Florence, a daughter of Mr. Emmanuel Pike, of Port-au-Pas, our most prominent Merchant, much against the wishes

of her family. At present he is the father
 of two children and his wife is now in a
 delicate state of health again. His enlist-
 ment was unexplainable until the reason
 developed later.

On the 15th ult., at the request of Poole's
 wife, I sent a Telegram to the Minister of
 Militia, of which the enclosed is a copy.
 I received a reply from Major Mont-
 gomery stating that as Jacob Poole
 had enlisted voluntarily he feared
 that nothing could be done. Major
 Montgomery also stated that Private Poole
 had allotted eight cents per day for the
 support of his wife and family which, with
 the separation allowance amounting to
 twenty dollars per month, was more than
 his wife was receiving from her husband's
 salary while he was Post-Master on the
 "Genoa". That letter I gave to M^{rs} Poole
 and consequently cannot forward it
 for your perusal.

I may also add that Jacob Poole

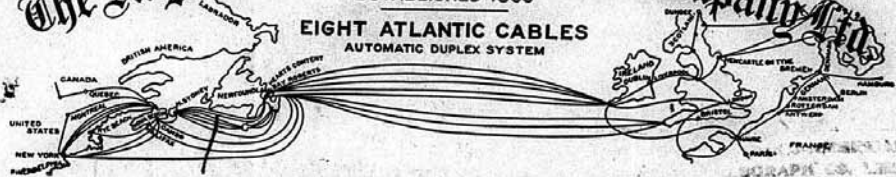
