The Chief Staff Officer interviewed Private Poole in connection with this case, and also got him to write a letter, the original attached hereto, from which it will be seen that this soldier denies any responsibility, both in the case of borrowing money and also in the other matter

Private Pool says that he had cancelled his request for permission to marry, and that he had applied to Captain Marshall for this cancellation. He states also that he had no intimate relations with this girl until August; and he has been told by other soldiers, whom he quotes, that they had intimate relations with her in April or May.

He disclaims any responsibility also with reference to the alleged loan of £12., and states that he did not at any time borrow any money from this girl.

It is understood that Private Binks is doing duty in your Office; he might be able to state something in this case. Private Vaters who is in this country, has not been interviewed; but if it is considered advisable, after you have considered Pte. Poole's statement and, perhaps, have seen the girl again with reference thereto, Private Vaters' statement will be taken on record of further communication from you.

Royal Newfoundland Regiment; I beg to
inform you that he proceeded to Newfoundland
land on 12/12/18 and it is not thought he
will return to this Country as a Soldier.
If you will call at this office and ask
to see Major Timewell or Lieut. Anderson,
your case will receive attention.

The girl in question called at
this office, with her married sister,
on 24/12/18 and stated her case. It
appears that she will shortly have a child
above named Soldier who was recently
attached to this office. She stated
that Poole promised to marry her and
that in addition to treating her as
he did, he borrowed a sum (her savings)
approximately £12. The girl also stated
she would be without money for the
support of the child, and that she
would necessarily have to enter a
home.

Poole, who asked for repatriation
on compassionate grounds (vide exchange
of telegrams with your office) was sent
to Newfoundland on 12/12/18, but it is
needless to say that were the present
circumstances known he would not have
been allowed to go. Some time ago
Poole asked for permission to marry,
which was granted, but he evidently did
not carry out his intentions.

If Pte. Poole admits his
responsibility, will you please
ascertain if he can be made to contribute
to the support of his child, which will
be born in about two months time, and
also what steps can be taken to recover
the money which he obtained from the
unfortunate girl.

Your communication No 1076, dated Aug 27th and Sept 9th respectively received to-day.

In reply to same I beg to state that I have known No 1076. Pte Stephen Poole, and his family for a period of fourteen years.

His father John Poole, aged 76 years, is an old worn out fisherman. He has no means of support and at present is living with a widow, who had been married to John Poole's stepdaughter.

Pte Stephen Poole had no sister or sisters, and only one brother. This brother, Ambrose A. Poole, aged about 37, is now enlisted in the Home Guard in the province of Quebec. He is married and does not contribute towards the support of his father.

John Poole is now making application for Old Age Pension, and if he secures that it will be his only means of maintenance. He has no home, other than that now charitably extended to him by his former stepson-in-law.

He may be deprived of this home at any time in the event of this man contracting a second marriage. The Stephen Poole is the only near relative on whom the old man, John Poole, can depend for support.

The girl also stated she would be without money for the support of the child, and that she would necessarily have to enter a home.

Poole, who asked for repatriation on compassionate grounds (vide exchange of telegrams with your office) was sent to Newfoundland on 12/12/18, but it is needless to say that were the present circumstances known he would not have been allowed to go. Some time ago Poole asked for permission to marry, which was granted, but he evidently did not carry out his intentions.

If Pte. Poole admits his responsibility, will you please ascertain if he can be made to contribute to the support of his child, which will be born in about two months time, and also what steps can be taken to recover the money which he obtained from the unfortunate girl.
