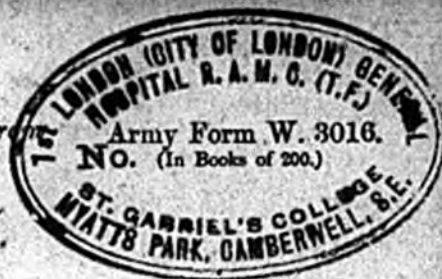



I am instructed to inform you that it is not within the purview of the powers of this department to grant furlough to soldiers who are serving in the United Kingdom, such soldiers come under the control of the War Office whose regulations at present on the matter of furlough are very strict. The War Office ruling is that only men who have been returned for discharge may be repatriated. It is a fact that the repatriation which arrived a day or so ago in Port au Basque was delayed for about four weeks after the original date of sailing owing to the lack of accommodation on Transports. However, your application will be forwarded to the proper Military Authorities in the United Kingdom concerning furlough for #310 Pte. D. Power, and when a reply has been received you will be informed.

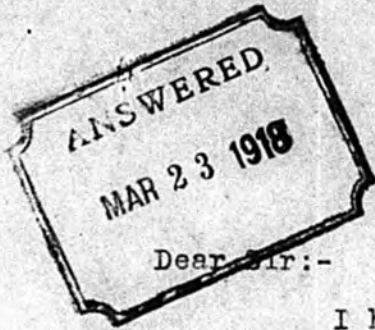



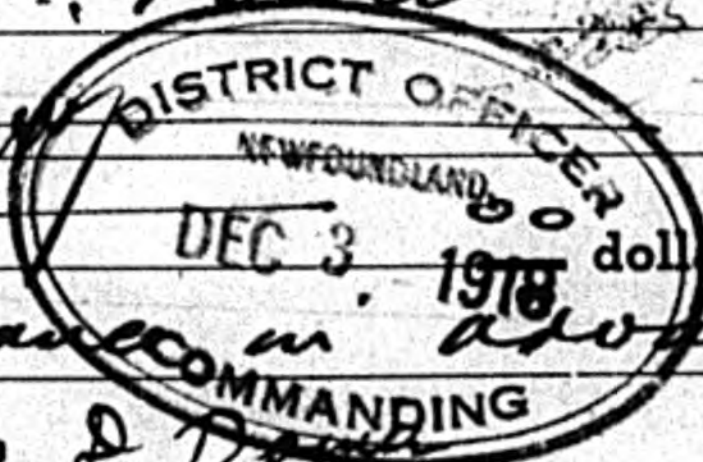
