Reference attached letter from Lieut. Power. There is considerable dis-satisfaction in this Battalion over the apparently naphazard system under which promotions are made in the Regiment.

The complaints made to me by Officers of the Battalion come under two headings,-

- (a) Officers given substantive promotion to higher ranks over the heads of other Officers who have not been reported on as unfit for promotion.
- (b) Officers being given "Temporary" higher rank, which for all practical purposes is much the same as substantive, instead of "heting."

Full justice can be done to any Officers of outstanding merit by granting them "Acting" higher rank.

With regard to the individual case of Lieut. Power this Officer has served under my command for only a short
time, but so far as I can judge he would seem fit for
promotion, in his turn, to the rank of Captain, unless he
has been previously reported on as unfit for promotion, I
consider that a grave injustice has been done him.

I would suggest that all promotions to substantive rank be granted in order of seniority, provided that the Officers in question are favourably reported on, and that Temporary Rank be granted very sparingly. There would appear to be no reason why it should now be granted to any Officers of the Regiment serving in this Country or in France.

Lt.Col. Berners R.N.R. 106/18 and my R.N.R. 225/18 refer to other complaints of officers over the question of their promotions.







Reference attached letter from Lieut. Power. There is considerable dis-satisfaction in this Battalion over the apparently haphazard system under which promotions are made in the Regiment.

The complaints made to me by Officers of the Battalion come under two headings,-

- (a) Officers given substantive promotion to higher ranks over the heads of other Officers who have not been reported on as unfit for promotion.
- (b) Officers being given "Temporary" higher rank, which for all practical purposes is much the same as substantive, instead of "Acting."

Full justice can be done to any Officers of outstanding merit by granting them "Acting" higher rank.

With regard to the individual case of Lieut. Power this Officer has served under my command for only a short
time, but so far as I can judge he would seem fit for
promotion, in his turn, to the rank of Captain, unless he
has been previously reported on as unfit for promotion, I
consider that a grave injustice has been done him.

I would suggest that all promotions to substantive rank be granted in order of seniority, provided that the Officers in question are favourably reported on, and that Temporary Rank be granted very sparingly. There would appear to be no reason why it should now be granted to any Officers at this. of the Regiment serving in this Country or in France.

Lt.Col. Berner's R.N.R. 106/18 and my R.N.R. 228/18 refer to other complaints of officers over the question of their promotions.



The nature of the casualty is required for telegraphing details overseas. If the details given are insufficient, reference back to the hospital for further information is rendered necessary. The following instructions should therefore be carefully followed in all Colonial cases:

(a) In the case of sickness, the nature and degree should be stated, e.g., enteric, slight.

(b) In the case of wounds, the nature of the wound, the part of the body affected, and the severity of the injury should be stated, e.g., gaushot, skull, severe.

If a limb has been amputated the fact should be recorded.

Tre.—These rolls should be forwarded direct to the War Office, Alexandra House, Kingsway, W.C., not later than the day after admission; envelopes to be marked C. 2, Casualties; rolls are not to be telegraphed in advance. The duplicate of the rolls should be sent to the Officer in charge of Records of the Colonial Contingent concerned.

Admissions to the outlying sections of the hospital should be shown separately. If the distance of these sections should render it impossible to forward the rolls the day after the admissions, the sections should be instructed to send lists (on these Army Forms) direct to the War Office, and to the Colonial Contingent Record Office concerned.


