

I beg to quote hereunder the details of the deed for which the Military Medal was awarded your son #2318, A/CSm. Maurice Power, Royal Newfoundland Regt., taken from supplement to the London Gazette.

"For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to  
"Duty. During the advance on the 20th Oct.  
"1918, when the Batta. was just in front of  
"the village Vichte, owing to the fact that  
"touch could not be gained with the right,  
"the situation was very uncertain. Pte.  
"Power at once volunteered to reconnoitre the  
"ground in front and to the flank. He went  
"out by himself about 600 yards in front and  
"worked all along the front of his Company  
"and to the right, being under heavy M.G. fire  
"the whole time. At one time he was fired  
"on from a house and although alone, he work-  
"ed his way towards it from cover to cover,  
"until he arrived there, entered it and cap-  
"tured four snipers who were hiding and had  
"been sniping from there. He brought back
