Dear Sir:

I enclose herewith, Medical Examiner's Report on Ex-Magistrate P.F. Power. I have already forwarded the investigating officer's report.

It may not be out of place for me to add here some further facts which have come to my attention. Ex-Magistrate Power's age is given on the Medical Report as 75-76 but the doctor states that his apparent age is 86-88. His wife is still living and both are dependent for support on a pension which Mr. Power received on his retirement from the Magistracy. Mr. Power spent approximately twenty five years in the Magistracy but his pension (due to a change in the rates of Pensions in 1934) was, to say the least, meagre.

Mr. Power's two sons were on active service in the Great War. One of them who survived is now married and works in the survey division of the Department of Natural Resources. He is unable to assist his parents.

The other son was convalescent for six years after the war until the time of his death. True, he received a pension up to the time of his death but the total amount of his pension plus some of his parents money was spent in care and medical attention for the invalided veteran.

Mrs. Power, wife of Magistrate Power played an active part in war work during 1914-18. She was President of the Women's Patriotic Association which did splendid service on Bell Island during the years mentioned above. She was awarded the O.B.E. for the work which she performed.

Mr. Power who himself spent the greater part of his active life in the civil service and gave his two sons an active service in the Great War is now making application to the Pensions Board for a pension allowance.

I feel sure that the Board, in view of the exceptional circumstances in this case, will give it the sympathetic consideration which it deserves and demands.
