

Dear Madam,-

Your husband, Stephen J. Power enlisted for service with the 1st Newfoundland Regiment, and was to have sailed on the "CALGARIAN" on the 19th June. All his papers were signed, and amongst others, an allotment to you of 80s per day. He did not however, go with the Contingent, and I understand, has left the Regiment now altogether, consequently, the allotment which he made should have been cancelled.

We have mailed you two cheques, one for \$15.20, and one for \$24.80, making in all, \$40.00. You must surely have understood, that as your husband did not go away, you were not entitled to this money, and you should have returned it to the Regiment at the time you received it. I have now to request, that you refund this amount to the 1st Newfoundland Regiment within ten days from the date of this letter, and avoid further trouble.

He is working on Bell Island just now but wife still draws or receives her 80<sup>¢</sup> per day-pay.
