

At the date of discharge of these men, the Demobilization orders not having been gasetted, I proceeded to deal with them in the ordinary manner, paying them as undernoted.

Each man received his cheque for \$49.90.

Demobilization orders were posted next day, and about a week or ten days afterwards I received instructions from you to deal with these men under these orders. Accordingly I issued cheques to each for \$49.90, making in all \$6000.

In explanation of this payment I beg to report that the Regulations governing Post Discharge Pay, superceded the issue of bonus - the equivalent of one weeks full pay and allowances - and in consultation with Lt. Col. Rendell, the decision was reached that the post discharge pay should include the bonus already paid, as otherwise men being discharged under the new regulations would receive in all, that much less than men who had already been discharged. In consequence of this decision the bonuses allowed these men were considered as payments on account of their clothing allowances, and post discharge pay paid in full. This course may be the cause of some misunderstanding on their part in regard to the clothing allowance, but as they received the full amount of their post discharge pay, it works out the same in the end.
