

Dear Sir,

With further reference to the matter of a Separation Allowance for R. S. Prince, Princeton, I do not think the Board of Review was in full possession of the facts of the case when they decided that Mr. Prince was not deserving of an allowance .

I enclose you copy of an extract of a letter received from Princeton which shows Mr. Prince to be confined to his bed, totally incapacitated. His son, No 3567 Josiah Prince was badly broken up and is at present in hospital at Halifax, undergoing an operation. With the allowance that he receives, he cannot help his father.

I trust you will, at the very earliest opportunity, bring this matter again to the notice of the Board, with a view to the reconsideration of Mr. Prince's case.

Dear Mr. Coaker,

I want to draw your attention to a certain man, who is really destitute here at Princeton, Robert S. Prince. Did you get letters from him a little while past, he has been sick for twelve months now. I think he applied to the Pension Board for aid. He had a son, Josiah Prince, who got badly broken up at the Front and who is at present undergoing an operation at Halifax. I think its too bad the Board does'nt do something for him, would you use your influence in that direction, he is certainly in need of help, he is confined to his house and bed all the time with consumption.

I acknowledge receipt of your letter of May 15th forwarding copy of letter from Mr. Samuel J. Prince, of Princeton, B.B., referring to the case of the father of No. 3567 Ex-Pte. Josiah Prince.

In reply I would state that the claim for Separation Allowance submitted by the father of this soldier has been under reconsideration, and the Board of Review can only confirm their former decision. It must be proved that a father who is claiming is totally incapacitated from earning a living and that the soldier is the sole support, before the Allowance can be granted. The same thing applies to a mother who is claiming whose husband is living; that is, that the husband must be totally incapacitated and the son the sole support. In the case under review a medical certificate signed by Dr. Barlow on 28th of May, 1918 stated that Mr. Prince, aged 51 years, was not a chronic invalid, but that he was incapacitated at that time from lumbago which he had then had for about six months. In answer to the question: "How long is total incapacity likely to continue and what will be the effect on earning power." Dr. Barlow states: "Should improve in the summer; will not effect earning power on return to work." In reply to the question on the claim to which this medical certificate is attached, which claim is dated May 40th, 1918, Mr. Prince states that the amount earned by himself per month is: "Nothing at present." This would imply that his disability is of temporary nature. A claim was submitted by Mr. Prince on 25th Feb. 1918, and in answer to the question: "State amount earned by yourself per month" he replied: "As a fisherman it is hard to estimate". And, on that form, in answer to the question as to whether he is a chronic invalid and totally incapacitated, he states: "Suffering from kidney trouble." Another claim was submitted on 15th March, 1920, and in answer to the question as to the amount earned per month by himself, he states: "I have not earned \$100.00 for twelve months."

In view, therefore, of the information submitted the Board of Review regrets that it is unable to grant the Allowance in this case. Of course, Separation Allowance is paid only for the period of time during which a soldier actually was serving. No. 3567 Pte. Josiah Prince was discharged on the 10th July, 1919; he left an allotment in favour of his father of 60¢ per day payable from 1st June, 1917 to the date of his discharge.

It is noted that Private Prince is at present

in hospital in Halifax. While in hospital he is credited with full disability pension, \$50.00 per month, of which he is paid \$10.00 while in hospital and the remaining \$40.00 remains at his credit. It is suggested that Private Prince might be willing to have a portion of this \$40.00 made payable to his father.

I might say that this claim is one of many which appear to be harshly dealt with; but the regulations are very clear, and the Board of Review have no discretionary power.
