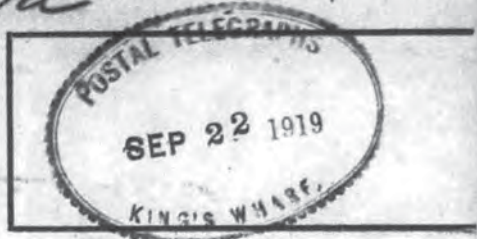

Dear Sir -

Have been writing to W.F. frequently since I have been in France and have had no answers, was wondering if there can be anything wrong with the postal system, since I have been here now 2 1/2 mos one would think an answer would come thro in that time. Of course in that time I have received many letters which you have kindly readdressed so I was wondering since my letters from England went thro OK, if I could forward my mail to you with Envelope enclosed or rather letter enclosed such as I will do now. Am liking the work fine, have been in a clearing station 8 weeks and now am attending the medical requirements of different-labor Companies situated about here.
