Dear Sir:-

Your letter of January 20th is to hand. In reply thereto I would state that I have enquired from the Pension Board concerning the case of Mrs. Elisabeth Vaters, and the Pension Board states she is getting a pension on account of her son, Edward Pye, deceased. I am informed that she was receiving \$16 a month pension up to 30th April, 1920. From that date until the 1st of April, 1922 no pension is payable; but from 1st April, 1922 she has been paid \$15 per month (not \$5 per month) which is being continued.

The pension Board are unable to see their way clear to increase this amount. A very full investigation of this case is on record in the Pensions Dept., who consider that under all the circumstances of the case, she could not expect to receive more than she is getting

Dear Sir, —

While at Carbonear to-day, Mrs. Elizabeth Vaters, of Victoria, saw me about temporary help. Her statement was, that her Son, (Edward Pye,) was killed in the war; that her husband, Moses Vaters, has been blind, more or less, for thirteen years; that she has two children; a boy, aged 14, and a girl, aged 13, and has no help except the son who can at best gather the firewood for the home.

Mrs. Vaters also stated that for a time she received \$16.00 a month pension or allowance, but that payment was stopped for two years and a half; that this pension was promised to be renewed, but she receives now ~~five~~ ^{fifteen} dollars a month. She requests that the amount of the money (pension) be paid her, and that the present amount be increased — on the grounds that her chief support gave his ^{life} ~~life~~, and that her present circumstances are such that the amount now received is insufficient to support her, her husband and the two children.

This is her statement. May I ask, on behalf of the woman, if it is correct. And if so, can anything be done to help her.
