In answer to your letter which I return re. Pte. M. Quigley's Will: On looking up his name in my book I find that I buried Quigley's remains in 5th. Corps Cemetery at Y. Ravine, Beaumont Hamel. I wrote to his sister, Mrs. O'Leary, 128, East Street, St. John's, Newfoundland, and evidently sent a copy of the Will which I found in Quigley's Pay Book. All effects were sent to H. Q., through D. A. G. C., of 5th. Corps with whom I did the burying. The Pay Books were rotten and almost unreadable - sometimes impossible - and it was a great effort to make them out. Quigley had been lying in the mud of a shell hole for 14 months. However anything found on his body was sent to H. Q., and that is all I can say.

Reference attached: There is no trace of an A. B. 64 or effects having been received here on account of Pte. Quigley, although numerous effects and A. B. 64 have been received here on behalf of the Officers, N. C. O's and men buried by the D. A. G. C., V Corps. These were in an extremely decomposed condition and it must be presumed that the portion of A. B. 64 recovered on account of Pte. Quigley fell to pieces and is now irrecoverable.

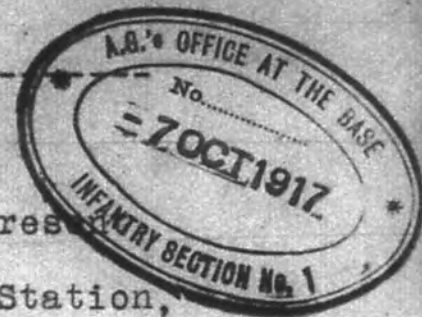



In answer to your letter which I return re. Pte. H. Quigley's Will: On looking up his name in my book I find that I buried Quigley's remains in 5th. Corps Cemetery at Y. Ravine, Beaumont Hamel. I wrote to his sister, Mrs. O'Leary, 128, Dept Street, St. John's, Newfoundland, and evidently sent a copy of the Will which I found in Quigley's Pay Book. All effects were sent to H. Q., through D. A. C. S., of 5th. Corps with whom I did the burying. The Pay Books were rotten and almost unreadable - sometimes impossible - and it was a great effort to make them out. Quigley had been lying in the mud of a shell hole for 16 months. However anything found on his body was sent to H. Q., and that is all I can say.

I have the honour to bring to your attention the following matter.

No. 861, Pte. Michael J. Quigley was killed in action on July 1st, 1916, but absolute proof of his death was only received in April 1917. He declared an allotment in favour of the Bank of Montreal, here, of sixty cents (60¢) per day, to be deposited in his own name only. This allotment commenced on June 1st, 1916, and payments were continued to the Bank of Montreal by us, until April 30th, 1917.

The bearer, his sister, has a letter from him regarding his affairs and one from the Chaplain of H.M. Forces, regarding his burial. She is enquiring re the balance of the money due him, of which he speaks in his letter, and I presume from the amount he mentions that he refers to whatever balance may be at his credit in the Bank of Montreal.

Will you kindly deal with the matter of this balance, and instruct this lady what is to be done. You will understand that this Department has no control of the deposit, as the money has passed out of our hands.

Dear Madam,

For some time past the Imperial Government have been making enquiries in relation to those men of the First Newfoundland Regiment who have been reported missing since the action of the 1st July. I very much regret to state, however, that from the correspondence which has taken place, a copy of which I enclose, it is evident that none of them are Prisoners of War in Germany, and the authorities are, therefore, reluctantly forced to the conclusion that all these gallant men, whose names are given in the enclosed list, and one of whom was very dear to you, were killed in that fateful action on the 1st of July.

I desire to express to you on behalf of the Government, as well as for myself, the sincerest sympathy in this time of sorrow. We feel the loss of our loved ones, but it will, no doubt, be some consolation to you to think that he, for whom you now mourn, willingly answered the call of King and Country, did his part nobly, and fell, facing the foe, in defence of the principles of Righteousness, Truth and Liberty. Though he has laid down the earthly weapons of warfare, he now wears the Soldier's Crown of Victory, and his name will be inscribed upon the Glorious Roll of Honor, and be held in fragrant memory by all his fellow-countrymen. When the victory is won, and Peace again reigns upon the earth, it will be a comforting thought to you that in this glorious achievement he bore no small part.

I trust that you may have the Grace and consolation of the Great Father of us all at this time.
