



With reference to your letter of 24th ult. I am directed to reply and inform you with reference to your enquiries therein that the Newfoundland Commission issued to you was not substantive. Honorary Commissions were granted in accordance with Army Order of Jan. 1st, 1919 dealing with the demobilisation of Cadets; and hence yours is honorary, and, therefore, under the Military Forces Act, 1918, you would not be called upon to again serve in the event of an outbreak of hostilities. If, however, you re-enlisted, you could claim the rank you held on retirement.

With regard to your enquiries to the statement on the Nfld. Commission that it has effect only in this Colony and its Dependencies, I might say that this Commission is an honour conferred by the Government of Newfoundland, and is effective only in Newfoundland, and does not entitle you to an Imperial Commission. 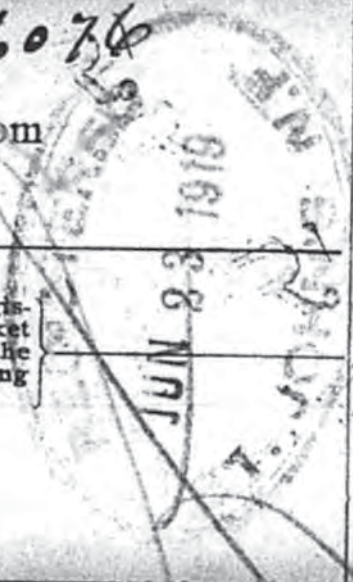

We are sensitive enough to know that the poor lads have enough to endure without any neglect on our part or on the part of those whose duty it is to attend to their wants. I trust Sir you will cause this to be put right and kindly forward satisfactory statement. or we shall have to demand our boys recall
