I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 1st inst., with reference to your son, #2738 Pte. Wm. Quinton, released Prisoner of War, and your enquiry as to the delay in receiving a notification from this Department of his arrival in the United Kingdom. Upon looking up this matter, I find that he was never officially reported as having arrived in England by the Record Office, London, and upon receipt of your telegram of January 3rd, and your letter of January 18th, we wired London asking for full particulars. To this we received no reply and hence the delay in again communicating with you.

However, I have much pleasure in being able to inform you that Pte. Quinton is with the "Corsican" Draft which is due to arrive here tomorrow.

Trusting that you will find him well, and regretting that there was such delay in getting the reply from London,

I wrote you last month asking for information of my son who was a prisoner of War in Germany, I got a reply saying you would make inquiries by wire at The Record Office, London, and let me know,

The same day I got your reply I received a Cable from my son at Hazeley, saying he was leaving for Home, by The Corsican,

I have not yet received a word from your Staff, as to the result of your enquiries, although a few hours, should have been ample time to get all the information required, happily we did not have to await the pleasure of your August Staff, to relieve our anxiety,

No doubt my son would have relieved our fears before but that he took it for granted he was reported in the regular way,

In my mind this is a very serious matter, and nothing short of criminal neglect on the part of somebody.

No doubt you will see that those responsible are dealt with in the proper way,

Unless there are circumstances



connected with the affair of which I am ignorant  
I shall not let the matter rest here, I suffered  
too much anxiety, that should have been relieved  
a month ago. If your staff, either at home or  
abroad had done their duty,

trace him. It should not be very  
difficult for the war office to learn  
something of him through the men  
who may have returned from the  
Camp, where he was confined.

The last word we had from him was  
written the 10 November, His address  
was Doeberitz Company, no 1.

There was no Wflder in the Camp with him  
and we should have to look among the  
English and Scotch who may have  
returned from his Camp to trace him.

I trust you will do your best at once.



Quinton, who is a Prisoner of War in Germany, and in reply I beg to state that we have nothing in our records to show that he was ever transferred to Holland, and upon making enquiries at the Office of the Daily News, we were informed that through a printers error they published the fact of your son being in Holland; but we are inclined to believe that all our Prisoners of War are now in France, awaiting their turn to be repatriated to England, and upon receipt of any news concerning him we will immediately communicate with you.

Dear Sir,

In reply to your letter of the 23rd inst., I beg to say that the arrangements which have been made regarding the transmission of parcels and other mail matter to those men of the Newfoundland Regiment who may be Prisoners of War in Germany, permit of the sending of parcels of food and clothing by the authorities in London to the extent of three parcels fortnightly for each prisoner. <sup>by father and</sup> Sums of money can also be remitted <sup>by friends</sup> through the Pay and Record Office, London, or, if the men so desire, such remittance can be made them out of their pay, in sums not exceeding two shillings weekly per man.

As regards your enquiry why private parcels can be sent to officers and not to privates, I can only say that the existing regulations are made by the German authorities, which as you can well understand, we are not in a position to question but may only accept them with the best possible grace. You may rest assured that your son and all other prisoners will receive all the attention from the Newfoundland War Contingent Association in London and other friends, as is possible, and that everything will be done for their comfort.

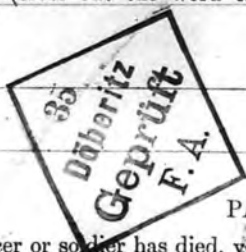


