I am in receipt of your letter of 3rd.,inst.
relative to James Quirk.

In reply,I beg to state that the Department of Militia was closed some years ago,and there are now no funds at my disposal for such claims as are put forward on behalf of this man. There was never any allowance made to men by reason of their being demobilized in the United Kingdom,but in some cases,where they wished to return home within a short time after demobilization,their passages were supplied either in whole or in part as circumstances warranted; sometimes by the Department of Militia,sometimes by the Nfld.Patriotic Fund, or by both in equal shares. The Nfld.Patriotic Fund is now about to go out of existence,and funds will not permit granting claims of this nature.

Application to the Great War Veterans' Association may bring results.

Doubtless you will be surprised to hear from me but I am writing so and if you can give me any information on the following.

Mrs. Michael Quint of Liverpool came to see me regarding her son James. He did not return following the war but as he had married in Scotland he remained there. Did any of our troops receive any allowance on remaining instead of returning home expenses?

He now wants to come home and as his parents, the other brothers having died, want him to work their land etc. but he wanted help from them. They cannot help him and his mother wanted to know if there was

any possibility of his being assisted
by the military authorities. I cannot
find his number, but he should be
easily traced, wounded July 1/16. I
told her that I thought it was too late
now to look for help from the
Military Dept as I understood it has
been closed.

I told her I would write and
enquire, but told her to write her son
~~and~~ and for him to apply to the
Dept. if such existed or the G. W. V. A. He
has a wife and 3 children and
has been out of work there for some
while. His intention is to come home
and when he can have his family
come out so well. In my mind the
G. W. V. A. might assist him if he made
an appeal to them. I knew him fairly well
and his matter came to me about it so
I promised to find out if the Dept. was still
functioning and thought you would
give me the information. I wish I am not
bothering you unduly.

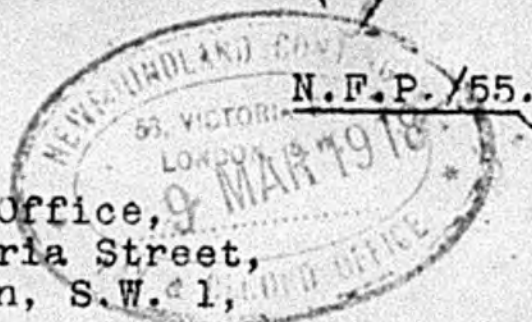
