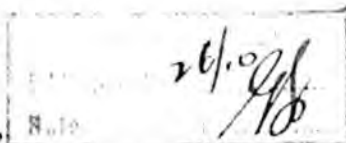



Dear Sir am writing you in regard to the separation allowance that concerns my mother (Mrs. Elizabeth Redmond of Avondale) I would like an answer telling me why it is that up to now she has had no satisfactory answer.

My mother knew nothing of the separation allowance till I came home and I supposed she was getting it till I mentioned it to her.

I served four years with the Regt and out of that time I was only a little over five months that I was not with. The first Batt on active service. Besides serving in Gallipoli I took part in every battle the Regt was in. excepting two and I was wounded in three the 1st of July '16. the 16 of Apr 1917 and Sept 21, 1918. and was back with the Regt again when the armistice was signed I know for a fact that there is not another man in the Regt can show that he saw more real active service than I can. and if you care to look up my Record in the Regt you will see that it is true.

I came home on the Corsica last Feb and when I got my discharge asked for

my mother's separation allowance I was given
the necessary papers to fill out I sent
them to her and she had them filled out
and sent in since that time she
has got very little satisfaction each
time she wrote she got an answer that
it hadn't been considered. I'll be
the only unmarried child my mother
has my father has been dead 12 years and
my only Brother was married over three
years before the war began at that time
I was all the real support my mother
had unless my bro or my married sister
felt that they could send her a little
at Xmas. Now when I went and told her
I was going to volunteer it didn't take her
six months to consider if she could let
me go or not. I was working at S. Falls at
the time and she was flying all alone
at Avondale. She could have stuffed me
if she wished she let me go and I went and
no one can say I didn't do my duty. Now the
separation allowance is trying to be kept from
her and fellows who didn't go till the war
was near over are getting and got the
separation allowance pensions and everything
else that going. I got no pension I asked
for none. Thank God I came home
sound in body and could take up

my old apt. but this separation allowance
 belongs to my mother by every right
 of Justice and I want it paid to
 that she gets it. I'm not asking any
 favors of the Nfld Government for
 my self I only ask whats due my mother
~~and~~ left it in her hands and she
 got no satisfaction up to now. now I'm
 going to take it up and see that
 Justice is done her for after all
 she is the one that should get a
 square deal for she let me go when
 she could have kept me home as a
 good many fathers do. She was
 the one who suffered four years
 of worry.

Now Sir I will ask you to kindly
 give this letter your earliest attention
 and let me know as to what your
 department means to do in the matter
 I will wait a reasonable length of time
 I will then take further steps thanking
