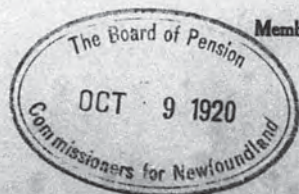

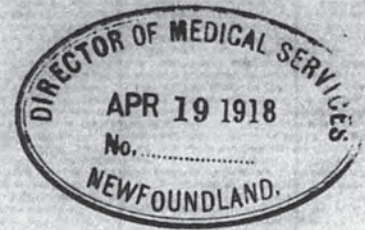



Dear Mr. Reeves,

In connection with the correspondence which has passed between us since General Dalton enquired of you whether you could raise men for the R.A.M.C. I annex copy of a decision arrived at by the Reserve Force Committee of the Patriotic Association. From this you will see that a definite policy has been adopted here not to enlist men for active service except for the requirements of our own Regiment. Therefore, any men whom you can furnish for General Dalton must be content to serve on the R.A.M.C. rate of pay and under British Service conditions. So it seems to me that you will have to send a negative reply to General Dalton, much as I regret not being able to assist him through the branch of the St. John Ambulance Brigade overseas.

It is possible that you may be able to get Sick Berth enlisted through H.M.S. "Calypso"; but there too the candidates would not benefit by the Newfoundland scale of pay nor by the local pension schemes.

2. Mr. Reeves has the names of 17 members of the local Ambulance Brigades who are prepared to volunteer, provided that they pass the Medical examination and provided they receive the same pay and allowances as are given to the men of the Newfoundland Regiment.

3. I am inclined to think that the question of pay presents serious difficulties. It is always difficult to brigade together men on the English establishment drawing 1/6d a day and our men drawing 5/- a day.

On the whole, I am of opinion that it is best to adhere to the principle on which we have so far acted, namely, not to enlist men except for duty with our own Regiment.

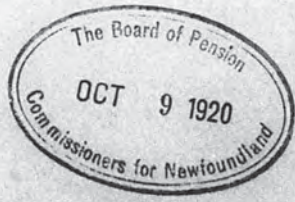

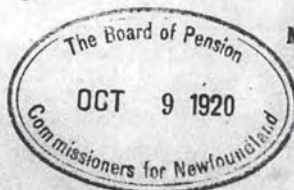
