I have your communication of 30th ult. As the matter is a medical one, I take it that it is entirely within your jurisdiction to take whatever action may be considered necessary with regard to the court of enquiry. This would be a medical court and would be convened by you.

In the present case I should think that there could not be any court of enquiry better than the Standing Medical Board, which has had all the facts placed before it, and which should be able to give an intelligent decision in the matter. From a military point of view the position would be, that the man, an invalided soldier, was sent before the Standing Medical Board, who recommended that he be sent to Convalescent Hospital for observation. In an ordinary case when O.C. Hospital reported a man fit for duty, he would be sent back to his unit, and be put on duty. In the present case the O.C. Hospital sent him back to the Standing Medical Board, who had ordered him to hospital for observation, and made a report on the case. On this report I should think, the Standing Medical ought to be in a better position to give a decision than any other Board that might be convened.

I cannot deal with the case until the man is reported fit for duty and returned to the depot. If the M.O. in charge of the case reported him fit for duty and he was sent to his unit and then refused duty on the grounds of illness, he would be sent before the Medical Officer at the Depot. If the Medical Officer at the Depot found him fit for duty, he could be proceeded against as a malingerer.

The marginally noted man was sent before the Standing Medical Board on February 5th. when he stated that he had Dysentery about three times a day, and felt very weak. He was recommended to the Naval & Military Convalescent Hospital for observation and on February 22nd. was sent there. On February 23rd., as O. C., Hospital, I examined him and ordered him to show all stools to the Matron. I found on February 26th. that he had neglected to comply with this order. He was not at Hospital at the time of my visit so I left him written instructions in the following terms:-

"The Matron has reported to me that you have disregarded my instructions re showing her your stools each day. You will regard these instructions as an order and see in future that it is obeyed."

On March 5th. I found that he had not shown any stools to the Matron. I had him brought before me and told him that if necessary I would give him "cells" unless he obeyed orders promptly so that he might be constantly watched day and night. He said as an excuse that he had been constipated most of the time since the written orders were given.

On March 8th. he claimed to have had no movement since the last visit. Laxative medicines were given continually and found to be necessary during the whole of his time in Hospital. There was no sign whatever of Diarrhoea during his whole stay in Hospital.

On March 28th. I sent him before the Standing Medical Board from whom I have the following note:-

"The marginally mentioned man still adheres
"to the statement that he has diarrhoea not-
"withstanding the report from the Naval &
"Military Convalescent Hospital that he has
"been constipated. We recommend a Court of
"enquiry."

Personally I do not see any particular need for a court of enquiry. I recommend that the man be returned to Duty forthwith and have no hesitation whatever in classing him as a malingerer.

Above noted man was warned for Overseas Draft which sailed on Tuesday 29th. inst. He was absent from Draft Parade on morning of sailing and on sending the Regimental Police to his Billet it was found that he was in bed ill, and could not be moved. I wrote to M.O. Depot, concerning him and I enclose herewith copy of my letter and his reply to same. He came to the Armoury yesterday on the Doctor's orders, to be weighed, and pending his (Doctors) report I placed him in Detention. On the advise of Dr. Burden, who did not consider it advisable to keep him in the Guard Room in view of his statements, he was later released and allowed out under open arrest. His case has come before Orderly Room and I have remanded him pending your instructions.

This man came home on 21-5-17., and as far as I can ascertain no papers concerning his Medical History or Conduct came with him, we have therefore no Official record of his movements previous

to his arriving here. He was boarded on October 17th. 1917 and was recommended "Retention in the Army- All1".

He was warned for Overseas Draft of December 11th. 1917 but was struck off same before its departure, for what reason I am unable to say. During the period between December 11th. and January 29th. he has not reported to any Regimental Sick Parades, but states he has been attended to by Dr. Anderson on several occasions at his Surgery. He was on Parade on the morning of the 28th. inst. and seemed O.K. I am informed that his father interviewed the Minister of Militia concerning him and one of his sisters, who is a nurse, saw Major Rendell and I received a letter from him, copy of which is attached.

I saw Major Rendell and Dr. Burden personally and explained the circumstances about Reid and Dr. Burden told me verbally that as far as he could tell there was nothing wrong with him, which statement is corroborated by his written report. 


