

On February 13th the Colonial Secretary of Newfoundland wrote to Mrs. Wm.H. Adamson, of this town, who is next of kin to the above noted soldier stating that this soldier had been reported killed in action. He further stated that no official record had been received nothing except the bare intimation that he was killed in action on October 12th 1916.

Will you kindly endeavour to obtain and give an official certificate of the death of this soldier. There is considerable life insurance money held up, which will not be paid until an official certificate is obtained.

Your prompt attention will be appreciated.

This man's recruiting papers show next-of-kin as William Randell; these papers were signed in 1915. From later correspondence it appears that William Randell en-listed in an English Regiment and the family have never heard from him after the end of the war.

Correspondence also shows that the soldier had a younger brother and sister, Cheeley and Elsie Rendell, who lived with an aunt, Mrs. Mark Janes at Campbellton. There is a receipt signed by Elsie Rendell in 1923 for Victory and British War Medals; the address given was Campbellton. The filw also shows that the deceased left an allotment to one Robert Cranford, New Harbour, who claimed to be his foster father.

The latest letter in the file, dated 1929, refers to a Mrs. Walter J. Snow of Howley. It is possible that this might be the sister, Elsie.
