





With regard to the Grave Site, all particulars so far received, have been transmitted to the Minister of Militia as customary, but for your information I may quote reports from the O.C. 1st Battalion, the latter being in response to a further application for the information desired:

Received at this Office 19th Nov. 1918.

Captain H.Rendell was killed on Sept: 20th near KEIBERG; during the advance while leading his company, about 11.00 on that morning, he was hit by a sniper through the throat, dying within two minutes. He was buried where he died and a cross erected over his grave.
