Referring to your memo, No.53, on the subject of Working Pay; before replying to this officially I would like to point out that the granting of this in one instance will presumably open up the question of it being applicable to others. For example, on Pages 33-4 of "Financial Instructions for the Canadian Expeditionary Force 1914" it will be seen that Working Pay applies to other employments.

The reference you enclose is the first I have seen or heard of. Is Col.Ward referred to, the Chief Paymaster C.E.F. and what Minister is referred to? Can I have a copy of the Order 14th October 1914?

It seems to me reasonable that I should know the history leading up to this matter, and I think you will agree that in the interests of consistency, before this extra payment is authorised we should know precisely the position, in anticipation of probable further claims of a similar nature.

I may say that I have briefly discussed the matter with Mr. Bowring over the telephone, and he agrees with my idea of writing you unofficially meantime.

As explained to you during the course of conversation on this subject, this question was raised by the Armourer Corporal who had received a schedule of pay for the Armourer Section from a Canadian Armourer Sergeant during a course of instruction on the Ross Rifle while we were stationed at Bustard Camp. The Minister referred to is a Canadian Minister and Col. Ward is, I presume, the Chief Paymaster, C.E.F. He signs himself "Lieut.-Colonel, A.P.G."

With further reference to yours of June 1st., in relation to the letter from Captain Butler, D.S.C., M.C., to the Chief Paymaster and his reply thereto, on the subject of wounds gratuities to offices: I would say that I submitted the same to a meeting of our Board on Saturday night, which, after consideration, reached the conclusion that it could not depart from the decision previously rendered for the following Feacons:-

- (a) Because the Newfoundland system of pay and pensions is based upon the Canadian system, and the latter did not provide for wounds gratuities, and does not, as far as we are aware, provide for them now, even though, as you point out, Imperial Officers have been granted increased pay latterly; and
- (b) Because, under the pensions regulations of the Colony, there is no power vested in this Board or the Permanent Pensions Board, to award any such gratuities.



The nature of the casualty is required for telegraphing details overseas. If the details given are insufficient, reference back to the hospital for further information is rendered necessary. The following instructions should therefore be carefully followed in all Colonial cases:

(a) In the case of sickness, the nature and degree should be stated, e.g., enteric, slight.

(b) In the case of wounds, the nature of the wound, the part of the body affected, and the severity of the injury should be stated, e.g., gunshot, skull, severe.

If a limb has been amputated the fact should be recorded.

Note.—These rolls should be forwarded direct to the War Office, Alexandra House, Kingsway, W.C., not later than the day after admission; envelopes to be marked C. 2, Casualties: rolls are not to be telegraphed in advance. The duplicate of the rolls should be sent to the Officer in charge of Records of the Colonial Contingent concerned.

Admissions to the outlying sections of the hospital should be shown separately. If the distance of these sections is render it impossible to forward the rolls the day after the admissions, the sections should be instructed to send lists
