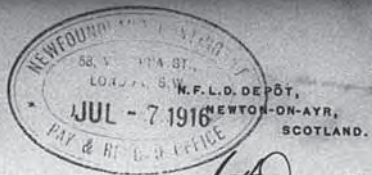



With further reference to yours of June 1st., in relation to the letter from Captain Butler, D.S.O., M.C., to the Chief Paymaster and his reply thereto, on the subject of wounds gratuities to officers I would say that I submitted the same to a meeting of our Board on Saturday night, which, after consideration, reached the conclusion that it could not depart from the decision previously rendered for the following reasons:-

- (a) Because the Newfoundland system of pay and pensions is based upon the Canadian system, and the latter did not provide for wounds gratuities, and does not, as far as we are aware, provide for them now, even though, as you point out, Imperial Officers have been granted increased pay latterly; and
- (b) Because, under the pensions regulations of the Colony, there is no power vested in this Board or the Permanent Pensions Board, to award any such gratuities.


