Sir, - Having been seriously wounded
in the head on July 1st 1916 which have
left me unfit for hard labour.

I am the only support of a widowed
mother. my Father having been dead for
fifteen years.

I get a Pension of thirty dollars and my
mother \$4.80 Per month.

I am writing to ask you if you will
help me to start a ^{commercial} business here in
South River.

Is it to much Sir to ask for the loan
of three thousand dollars for twenty years
to Pay back in four Payments at a 5%
interest.

I will give as security my house and six
acres of land valued at the same
amount as refered to above.

Trusting that you will kindly consider
my request & thanking you for a reply

Dear Mr. Squires:-

In reply to your letter of July 24th concerning the case of Mr. Cyril Richards of South River, I would state that a pension of \$30.00 is the maximum that can be paid for his disability as at present assessed. If at any time his disability should increase, he should apply to his local doctor for a certificate and forward that direct to the Board of Pension Commissioners, asking for a reconsideration of his case.

The object of his writing you on July 22nd is to see if he could raise a loan of \$5,000 payable in four installments in periods of five years each, at a 5% interest. The Civil Re-Establishment Committee are unable to assist Mr. Richards in this respect. I respectfully suggest that Mr. Richards be advised to endeavour to raise the loan that he requires by the ordinary business methods; he states that he has a house and six acres of land as security. It is presumed that no Government would undertake to run a banking establishment in any of its departments. This is presumably what is suggested by Mr. Richards' letter. It is regretted that no assistance can be given him through this Department



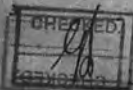
