

We received a few days ago a letter from No. 4281, Private Stephen Rose of Hamden, White Bay, stating that your son, No. ⁴⁰⁷⁰~~4281~~, Private Simon Ricks, who was reported missing on Sept. 29th, 1918, and later presumed dead, was killed by a shrapnel on Ypres front, on Sept. 29th and that he, Pte. Rose, assisted to bury him. The latest report on our records concerning your son, stating that he was presumed dead, was forwarded to you on April 26th, 1919; and this information will be conveyed to our Record Office, London for the benefit of their records. I am attaching hereto a copy of private Rose's letter.

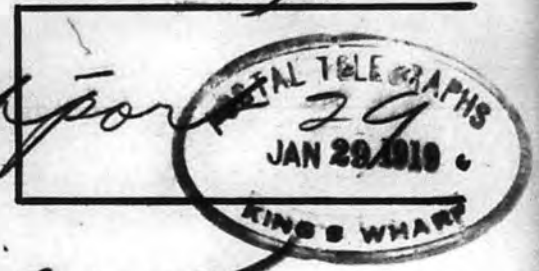
