Dear Madam,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 20th instant, making enquiry regarding your brether, Private H. D. Ridout. News of his being wounded reached this office on the 10th instant and on the 20th July we received further particulars, stating that he had been admitted to Clandon Park Hospital at Guildford, England, and that he was suffering from gunshot wounds in the forearm and back. These wounds are not described as serious but simply severe and, from such description, we do not anticipate any ill result but simply that he may take a little longer to reach complete recovery.

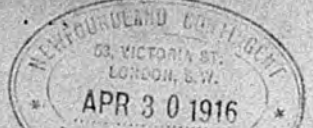

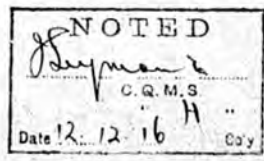

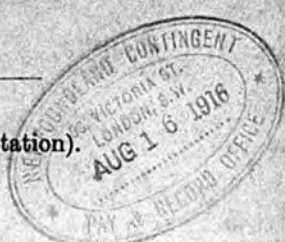

Letters of Administration of the estate were forwarded to Mr.Rideout on Oct.4th.1919,as they were not ready at the time of his visit.

In view of these circumstances,I submit that the claim that there was negligence on the part of the Militia Department does not hold.
