

This is to certify that I became acquainted personally with Dr. M.C. Roberts in April and May 1915. At that time Dr. Roberts was arranging his affairs in order that he might offer himself to the Crown on active service in the Royal Army Medical Corps.

An appointment having been offered to him, he left Newfoundland on June 17th 1915 and was gazetted Lieutenant in the R.A.M.C. on an engagement for one year. After the expiry of the engagement, he obtained his discharge on July 15th 1916, having spent the greater part of his service in the Tighne Hospital at Malta. I have not seen his official papers but am assured by Dr. Roberts that the conclusion of his engagement was due to private and personal causes which required his return to Newfoundland.

Dr. Roberts holds the Degree of M.D.,C.M. of McGill University. He spent 1½ years as house physician and house surgeon in the Royal Victoria Hospital, Montreal; and for 4 years he has been in general practice in St. John's, in association with his elder brother.

Dr. Roberts is a native of Brigus, in the Colony of Newfoundland. This statement is furnished to him at his personal request.

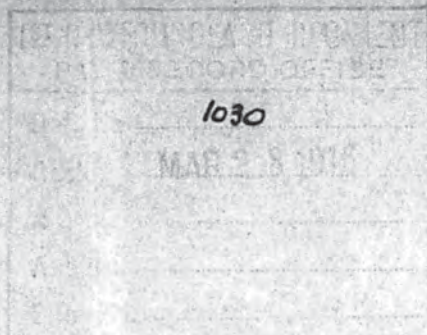


