

The attached was received in this Office this morning without any covering letter, and I cannot tell who it is from.

This man is not on the strength of this Unit.

Also there is no certificate of character of the man's intended wife upon which I can base my approval.

N. F. P/84 indicates the Regimental particulars and address of the Soldier by whom the claim was forwarded and covering letter would not appear to be necessary. Unfortunately the Soldier apparently omitted to send you his intended wife's character certificate, which is now enclosed, together with Marriage Certificate. Pte. Rogers was admitted to Hospital from the B. E. F. suffering from GSW. r. arm and has been Medically boarded and recommended for discharge from the Service. In accordance with General Instructions issued with A.C.I. 15 of 1917 he is understood to be on the strength of your Unit until he embarks for Newfoundland, which will be as soon as transport is available.



I am writing to ask you if it is necessary to do so as our local J. P. Mr: William York is somewhat aged & does not enjoy the best of health & we do not like to trouble him so often. Should you however deem it best, my husband will get it done as soon as possible. We have not been up to London since our arrival, but at our earliest convenience will make a point of visiting your Office & answering any questions you wish to ask us. In N.F.L.D. we filled these forms once a year at the most. I do all the writing outside signatures on John Rodgers my husband, is disabled badly in his right arm & writes with difficulty.

I would like to explain that according to instructions received from Newfoundland, I have to send out these forms to pensioners in the United Kingdom twice annually, i.e., at the end of June and November. If, as is the case with your husband, a pensioner should come to this country from Newfoundland, it is the custom to obtain a completed form from the pensioner in question shortly after arrival and irrespective of date, so that full particulars may be entered, after checking, in my Pension Pay Ledger, as early as possible. In the circumstances, I would be glad if you would kindly have the form sent your husband completed and returned to this Office at an early date.

I note that you and your husband intend coming to London at your earliest convenience, when you also intend visiting this Office. I shall look forward to the pleasure of seeing you both and in placing my services at your disposal in any way that it is possible to do so.
