 this latter may have been the last
 fibres were by him, containing pictures
 of self & at least 2 other boys who
 are now missing. This fibre was spread
 according to me by the Dragoon lads
 the afternoon previous to his death: you can
 easily understand the peculiar interest
 which such a discovery would have
 to his immediate friends: his death is
 and not very valuable but would be
 a reminder of him to some friend.
 Hoping you may help in the matter
 and the sooner the better.

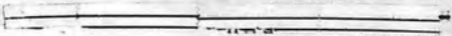
