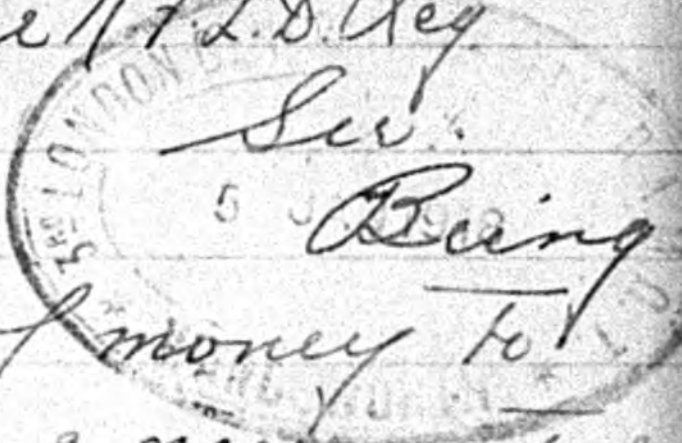

The marginally named man is one of our students who is about to proceed to Canada for a course of training in engraving. He may proceed any day now as we are only waiting for a telegraphic message before sending him off. The Civil Re-Establishment Committee will be paying his passage, and his allowances while in Canada will be at the rate of \$50.00 (fifty dollars) a month. It is easy to understand that a man travelling and living in a foreign country will have expenditures which would be unnecessary if he were living in his own country. I therefore beg to ask that an exception be made in his case and that he be permitted to draw his war service gratuity in the regular way. His pension rate is \$10.00 (ten dollars) a month but at the present time he is receiving nothing from the Civil Re-Establishment Committee.

I consider the request a most reasonable one and I am sure that the money will be judiciously and well spent by Mr. Roper.
