Dear Dr. Whalen,

I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 22nd inst., having reference to the case of John Rose, deceased, ex-Naval Reservist, and ex-member of The Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

As you are aware this man was Killed in Action on November 20th 1917, but, for some reason or other, his Regimental Accounts have not been sent from London as yet. I shall immediately have an inquiry made, and when they are received, Administration Papers will have to be taken out for him, which estate will include the amount of \$124.74 (One hundred and Twenty Four Dollars and Seventy four cents) due him as Augmentation Pay of the Royal Naval Reserve, in this Department.

As to the question of "Prize Money" the statement is incorrect that the mother of Reservist Mahoney received "Prize Money" from me, or through this Department. We have nothing to do with such payments, but if you desire to make inquiries about it, I would refer you to the Senior Naval Officer, Major McDermott, who will, no doubt, be able to give you information on this subject.

I might say that the Administration of deceased soldiers and sailors is taken out through the Department of Justice free of charge.

There are certain monies due the relatives of John Rose, deceased Royal Naval Reserve Man, which they have asked me to write you about. John Rose joined the Royal Naval Reserve and went across on S.S. Mongolia Feb 14th 1915. He gave a list of his next of kin Mrs Johanna Curlew (Curlew). He served on H.M.S. Paramount. The crew of this ship received prize money money which was paid to Rose or his relatives. Amongst the crew serving with Rose was one Mahony from Conception whose mother received the prize money I through you. After Rose fell in his time in the navy.

He returned home and enlisted in the Royal Irish Regt,
won the Military Medal and afterwards made
the supreme sacrifice.

You will please give this claim your
every attention as his people now are in for Circumstances.
I shall gladly attend to anything required on this
end.

I am an old man and also cripple and in very poor circumstances and if there is any money allowed me from my son I would like to get it if any one else is getting it I would like for you to find out and let me know I am the father of that Boy and I would like to derive is Beneficial if there is any probably in Whelan's receiving my money

The money which I am inclosed to you I also hear
that there is a person allowed aged parents from their
sons who was killed during the war I have written
different parties about it and I cannot hear anything
about it so I would like you to know find out for
me and let me know about both things if you
would oblige me or if my granma is receiving it
my reason for expecting my granma for receiving the
money is when my son was home on furlough they
induced him to will all is money to him saying he
was married to his sister so through that I
have my doubts of them receiving it very hard vent.
if after a further working for a son and bringing
him to perfection now when he has needs is
help others are enjoying it I trust you will not be
offended by the brief note but look at it in a
right & reasonable way
