

In reply I beg to inform you, that at a decision of the Patriotic Finance Committee, it was decided that all allotments of deceased men payable to other than mother or father would be discontinued. It was not, however, the intention of that Committee to deprive those who might be dependents on a deceased man, therefore if you were depending on Pte. Rose for your support, will you kindly write to the Paymaster (Capt. J. W. Howley), giving in detail the number of your family, circumstances, etc., when your case will be reconsidered, and if you are considered a dependent upon the late Pte. Rose, the allotment will be continued until such time as your case is considered regarding pension.

With reference to your letter of February, 25th., I regret that you are not satisfied with the arrangements made concerning the late Pte. Rose's allotment. I trust that I may be able to make myself perfectly clear in this regard.

As you state, there is a possibility of Pte. Rose being alive and a prisoner. This, I sincerely trust, will prove to be the case, and if it is so he will receive full pay for all the time that he is a member of the Royal Wilt. Regiment and if he should turn up his allotment will be paid to him in full, but on the other hand, in all cases of men reported missing the procedure is to assume, that after a reasonable time has elapsed for them to turn up, they have died on or since the date on which they were first reported missing. They will therefore be treated as dead men for the time being, to be confirmed by their never being heard from again, or proved to be wrong by their eventually turning up, and in view of the fact that the allotment, in the case of Pte. Rose is not necessary towards anybody's support, it would be useless to make payments to a man who is considered dead, whereas if this contention is proved to be wrong, it is a simple matter to make up back payments.
