
Sir,

Your letter of 9th February, concerning Stephen Rose has been returned from the Record Office, London. This department has written to the Senior Naval Officer, St. John's, asking if they were aware of a man as described by you, having enlisted in the Royal Naval Reserve. They state that he has not been enrolled or registered as a candidate for entry. As far as can be gathered he has not enlisted in The Royal Newfoundland Regiment either. Two men called Stephen Rose have enlisted with the Regiment and I will give you their particulars in case either might be the man you are inquiring about. #4206, Pte. Stephen Rose--father John Rose, Comfort Cove, N.D.B., enlisted on the 1st December, 1917, when he was 19 years old. #4218, Pte. Stephen Rose--mother, Lizzie Powell, of Twillingate, enlisted 31st December 1917, age 18½ years. Both of these men were at Winchester on the 15th March, 1918.

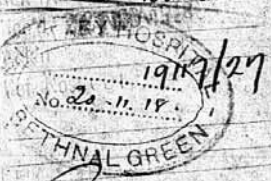

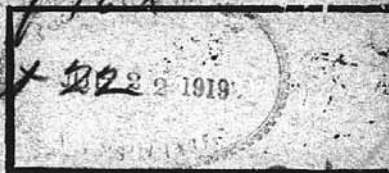

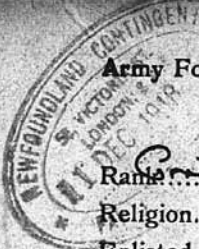
