Dear Dr:-

With reference to the letter which Mr. F. Wiseman of Trinity has written to His Excellency, the Governor, complaining that a certain soldier arrived at Trinity and received no welcome, I hope that the Patriotic Association does not agree with the idea of shouldering the shortcomings of the Trinity people on the authorities in St. John's if so, my reply to the letter would acknowledge responsibility on my part, which I do not for a moment intend to grant.

To begin with, the arrival of invalided soldiers is always given a prominent place in our daily newspapers, to prepare people for their home coming, and it is presumed that a paper or two goes to Trinity. When the men arrive here they are given a hearty reception, as is well known. Then they report at Headquarters, and later they report at the Pay Office, the last resort of soldiers who desire a little of the necessary means of proceeding further. Here they are given a sum of money, and when they so desire, a pass to their homes, but there is no guarantee demanded that they are going home, or that they are to go to-day or to-morrow or next week, and the idea of advising every magistrate in the island by wire that a soldier belonging to any particular settlement has been given a passage home and may appear there some time or other unknown is certainly about the limit.

I trust that this information will serve to dissipate any idea in the minds of any of the N.P.A. as to any neglect on the part of any of the Regimental authorities in this matter, as I think Mr. Wiseman's suggestion a preposterous one, and I should imagine that any soldier who has been away from home for a long time, particularly on such service as our men have been, would be sufficiently thoughtful to advise his people of his probable arrival.

The reception was, no one at the station to meet him, and he had to bring his valise, a distance of a mile to his home in Trinity. There was no one at the station to meet him for the simple reason, that no one in Trinity had been notified as to the date of his arrival home.

I would like to know who looks after the wounded soldiers in St John's, and sends them off to their homes. I think whoever that gentleman is

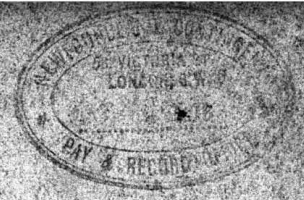



It is only two weeks since he was told by the doctors he ought to return to Newfoundland. Nowan Australian doctor who has seen him in his ward (Ward doctor, I imagine) says he can go to the Depot.

Rowe feels very much aggrieved, and says he will never be fit for duty again, and considers he certainly ought to go home.

I promised to see Captain Timewell about it, and it seems to me a case that should be sent back, on his showing.
