It is claimed by the sender of two parcels addressed to No. 611 Cpl. Harry M. Rowe c/o P. & R. O. that he has not received them though they were forwarded from St. John's, May 15th., and Aug. 21st. 1917.

Will you kindly state if and when they reached your office, and their fate.

Records in this office show that the first parcel referred to mailed at ~~from~~ St. John's 15/5/17 and entered as No. 16 on Parcels Bill No. 20, reached here on 8/6/17 and was forwarded on the same date to the 29th Infantry Base Depot where addressee was then located.

The other, for which no entry can be traced on Bills from St. John's, reached here on 12/9/17 and was despatched to the 1/1st Newfoundland Regiment, but as addressee had proceeded on a course of instruction, the Post Orderly, according to entry on his receipt form, redirected it to the 4th Army School of Instruction.

It is feared that in view of the fact that Cpl. Rowe was killed in Action on 20/11/17 no result would be gained by forwarding the enquiry to the B.E.F. as it could not now be ascertained whether he actually received the parcels or not.

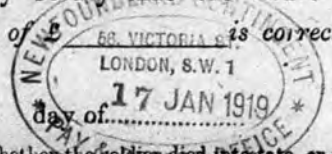
