

I have the honour to acquaint you that Commander MacDermott, R.N., of H.M.S. BRITON, having recommended to the Home Defence Committee that Acting Sergt. Edward Russell, of the First Newfoundland Regiment, who has been employed at Fort Waldegrave, St. John's, in connection with Naval Defence, should be permitted to proceed to England in order to take a gunnery course, the said recommendation has been approved.

The Home Defence Committee would be glad if you will make the necessary arrangements for the continuation of Acting Sergt. Russell's pay during his absence in England.

Explanatory.

My reason for writing to you, is that we are under the Navy for discipline only, who has nothing to do with our financial affairs, and my right to address you directly, instead of through the C.O. of Battery is given me by being as it is termed in Naval parlance, the Opposite Member of the C.O. of Battery, as I have always been held responsible for everything occurring during my 24 hrs of the watch, by the O. C. I mean the Senior Naval Officer, taking orders from him only whilst on duty. or in other words End Lieut-Holloway is held responsible for his watch, and I for mine without reference to each other.

Sir,

I am writing you on behalf of Mr. Arthur Lucas & Mr. John Hennessey & also on my own behalf with regard to our right to separation allowance granted to all married members of the 1st N.S. S.I. Regiment,

Now with regard to the matter of our claim, the facts are as follows, Requests (as to being entitled to this allowance) was sent forward through the C. G. of Battery who after some delay was furnished with a printed form from the Pay & Record Office in St. John's, for us to fill out & get signed by a magistrate or P. also a clergyman & some member of Patriotic Association, all of which was done by said Lucas & Hennessey, (but I did not fill out mine, for reasons of my own) Later, Lucas & Hennessey was requested to call at Pay Office & make allotments to their wives out of their fortnightly pay, which was done by them, which amt. has not been paid to them or their families for two pay days

now, upon their personal application for same, they are still informed they are not entitled, after filling out the forms provided for them, One person telling them they are not on active service, & another telling them they are not members of the Regmt. Now Sir I will give you a short acct of the whole,

On June 5th 1916, I personally received an order from Gunnery Mate Lloyd of H. M. S. Briton to report on board said ship on 6th, next day, with the six men & myself who had previously been selected & picked by Lloyd & self from 243 men who had been voluntary training Sundays & at night both on board ship & at Fort Amherst firing practice, all the previous winter to fit ourselves for service if need arose, as everyone of us had offered for enlistment in the Regmt, & for various reasons had been rejected,

Lieut. Holloway had nothing to do with firm's crew, from June 5th to June 15th 1916, on which date he relieved me, from duty, taking his time & Co.

Sir,

On reporting on board H. M. S. Briton, to Capt MacDermott, He ordered me to take five crew up to C. I. B. Armoury to have them sworn in, on arriving at Armoury I reported to Capt Montgomerie as he was then styled, informing him of my order from Capt MacDermott. He, Major Montgomerie then had them sworn and attested as members of the Regiment, giving all of us our official number, telling me I, as far as he was concerned I would have the rank of Sergeant, a rank I had previously held with the 1915 Northern Expedition. I then reported on board H. M. S. Briton and carried on training as usual until June 13th we formally took charge at Fort Waldegrave acting alternately as Officer in charge, subject to Orders of Senior Naval Officer, I mean alternately with the C. O. of Battery.

In Dec. of 1916 I was informed by Capt MacDermott that I had been selected to proceed to Eng. to take a course in Gunnery, & as equally as Gunnery Instructor, informing me that I had been granted a 3 months leave of absence by the Regiment but that Fifty cents per day would be deducted from my pay. I asserted, and was further informed that I would be required to sign an agreement with the Fort. to place myself at their disposal on my return Governor. Sir Walter Davidson would not hear of it, my word to be given Capt MacDermott & his word to them, my expenses were paid from a fund left by Capt Wakefield to the Legion of Frontiersmen, as application to J. J. Fenelon will confirm, While overseas I had the honor to be attached to a body of the finest & best disciplined body of men in all England, The Royal Marine Artillery at Eastney near Portsmouth,

and who on all occasions forms the Personnel Guard for Royalty while going to or from the Isle of Wight, while there I took the machine gun course, Maxim Kicks & Pom. Pom, also 3 pounder, Semi Automatic 3 & 4 Hotchkiss 6 pdr. do 12 pdr. I. S. same as we have at Battery of which type there are 4 all different in construction, mounting & Range, also 4 & 6 in Naval Gun. B. L. 12 in. I. S. also a short course in Repository, at Fort Cumberland i.e. shifting heavy guns, improvising ways & means of doing so with all kinds of material, chiefly common sense.

I left here at 10⁰⁰ hours 26th Dec. 1916 arriving back here 28th March 1917 taking up duty at Battery again I lost 50 cts per day on my pay for that time Spent Fifty Dollars of my own money, and I am doing an Officers work

(Lt Walden)

with the additional work of C. Madsen of Battery not onerous in itself, but still extra & necessary for one person to do, instructing new men as occasion requires all for a ordinary Serfs pay hitherto I have not objected in any way but if the C. O. of Battery, can be paid full emolument for one third of the work I am doing getting his Separation allowance, or being told he would get it? while we are told we are not entitled to say the least it seems very unfair.

The principle involved is what my young son's body is rotting on the soil of France, Mc Lucas's brother the same, Hennessey's brother's body in the North Sea. (namely justice) to all.

I feel I need not say anything further as your well known sense of fair play will give us justice On behalf of Lucas & Hennessey. I remain etc


