The Regulations governing the issue of War Service Gratuity, provide, that if a soldier dies before he has received any or all of his War Service Gratuity, the balance due him may be paid to his dependents. As payments in such a case would establish a precedent, which, though applicable in only a very few cases, is nevertheless one which I do not consider I have the authority to set, I shall be obliged if you will give me a definite ruling on the matter, if only in connection with the present case.

Might I respectfully suggest that the balance be used for payments of the enclosed Bills, and any amount due late Pte. Saunders over and above the amount of these Bills be disposed of at your discretion.

If the story of the treatment of one of our returned men be true, and it is current talk in this town and accepted as fact, then those responsible should have the opportunity of explaining their action or neglect.

One of our men who was awarded the Military Medal while on duty with Our Regiment in France and was severely wounded, was returned in a very weak condition with a German missile in his body.

After spending some time with his parents, his wounds gave him trouble and he became very weak and sick and went to St. John's for hospital treatment. While at St. John's he was moved from the West End to a place which had been hurriedly fitted up and where conditions were, not to him at least, satisfactory. Our sick and wounded friend and hero came back home and of late has been very ill, in fact he is (too ill) at the present.

Since Christmas, it is said this young man has received one cheque from the authorities for the sum of Ten dollars (\$10.00).

Now, Mr. Editor, the question is: "Who is responsible for such treatment to a brave soldier who underwent the terrific experiences of Gallipoli and who lost too much blood in France to get back again to normal and who was awarded the Military Medal for his action upon the field?"

In the name of Newfoundland, by those in authority, is such treatment being handed out to the men who have made such sacrifices for her and to whose efforts and sacrifices she owes so much? Is such true? Can it be?

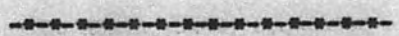
