No.2433 Pte. C. Stevens states:-

About 7.25 p.m. yesterday I happened to go into the scrub behind D. Coy's lines, and I saw a man lying down-- I thought at first he was asleep, but on going up to him I saw that he was dead. He was lying on his face, and his rifle was there. I did not touch him but went straight off and reported to the officers who were sitting round a table in the officers lines.

Rev. Father Nangle. R.C. Chaplain. states:-

On hearing of the matter I went at once to the place, and saw Pte. Scott lying on his face in the bushes-- his rifle was lying by his right side. I picked up the rifle and opened the breech and found an empty case in the breech. The magazine was not charged and the cut off was closed. His bayonet was lying loose on the other side of him.

Capt. Tocher, R.A.M.C. states:-

About 8 p.m. yesterday I saw the body of Pte. Scott. He had been dead not less than 16 hours. He died from a wound which passed through the base of the heart and the upper portion of the left lung. The entry of the wound was in

front of the chest and the point of exit below the left shoulder blade. The wound of entry was powder pocked, as if fired at close quarters. This would occur whether shot through the clothes or not. Death must have been instantaneous. It was possible from the position of the wounds, to have been self inflicted.

The day before yesterday, just after roll call at night, I saw Pte. Scott run past my bivouac with rifle and bayonet fixed-- he was carrying it at the high port. When he passed the drain close by he carried the rifle at the "secure". I did not see him any more. I thought he must be going to get his rifle inspected.

Pte. Scott was in my section. I saw that he was present at roll call the night before last. He was a very quiet man, and never seemed to associate with anyone else. He was one of the last draft that joined us a short time ago. I noticed the day before yesterday that he neither eat his dinner or tea. I asked him what was the matter, but he did not answer. Yesterday when I found that he was missing from his bivouac I saw that all his kit was present except his rifle and bayonet.

Dear Sir,

I beg to acknowledge your letter of the 28th August, asking for further information on behalf of your mother regarding the death of your brother Private Maxwell Scott. Any further information that may come in will be at once communicated to you, but I do not think that we can obtain the details for which your mother is looking.

I really do not know with whom you could communicate with the object of getting more definite information. Perhaps the better plan would be to write Major Timewell, Newfoundland Pay and Record Office, 58 Victoria Street, London, S. W., asking him to send forward your letter to some person in France who would be able to give you more particulars regarding your brother's death. He would probably forward your letter to the Clergyman, or to some Captain or Lieutenant who possibly would have intimate knowledge of the operation at the time, and who could from some of the men obtain the further details so much desired.

Major Timewell, in the Record Office, forwards to us all information which he receives, so that I am sure he will have nothing new to tell you, but that is the only channel that I am aware of whereby you may possibly receive fuller particulars.



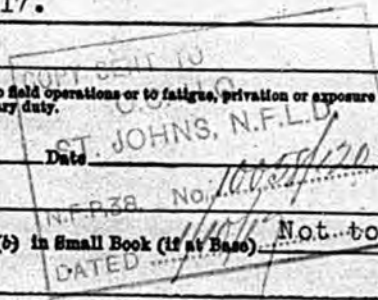
