Private Arthur Sexton, of the First Newfoundland Regiment holding certificate of discharge No. 2665 dated 28th February 1917. in consequence of being no longer physically fit for war service has been living in Edmundston for some time and trying to earn his living working at his trade as a carpenter. He can no longer work because his wounds have not completely healed and have broken out, and according to Dr. Sormany who examined him he requires hospital treatment. Enclosed you will find a certificate of his condition from Dr. Sormany. The pension of eight dollars which he receives is not sufficient to support him and while in this condition he can do nothing to add to the pension to help to maintain himself. He has asked me to communicate with you to see if anything can be done to assist him towards recovery so that he can make his own living. I have known him for about a month and he is a sober steady man and is deserving of all aid to which men in his condition are entitled.

Dear Sir:-

I shall be much obliged if you will kindly take an interest in the case of one Arthur Sexton. I know that his career has been a checkered one and that circumstances have rather tempted or compelled him to do some things that he should not have done. Nevertheless he has been, I think, to some extent the victim of vicious circumstances and he is to-day in a very poor way. He enlisted on the 29th of April, 1916, some time in his life previous to that he had been in hospital for tubercular disease of the spine, but the sore had been cleansed and healed and the doctor who examined him previous to enlistment found nothing wrong with him and passed him as sound healthy for Military service. The young fellow enlisted in good faith and went over to give of his life, if need be, in the cause for which all the lads when to fight. After some months of training here in St. John's he was passed as fit and sent over to Scotland where

his back broke down under the increased severity of the drill and he never reached the front. I feel that the State has assumed grave responsibility in accepting this type of man. I can readily understand that if his back were delicate the severe military training would cause a breakdown and I am willing to believe it to be possible that his present condition may be largely due to his military training. If there is any doubt on the subject, I think that he should be given the benefit of the doubt just as a prisoner at the bar is given the benefit of the doubt. At the present time he is not fit to do a day's work and his disability is slated at %60. You will agree with me that it is difficult to assess the aggravation. The Standing Medical Board has put it at 20%. I would ask the Board of Pension Commissioners to be more generous and to place the disability as high as their conscience will permit them and as high as they would do if the case under consideration were ^{that of} their own son, for after all I think that is the right way to look at it. The papers of his reboard are dated February 11, 1919.

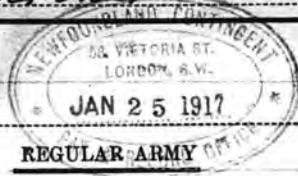


